Despite this, many of you have very good attendance and the half termly events, introduced by Mr Heeley, for those with high attendance, and the weekly draw for a book for those with 100% attendance and punctuality are very popular.

Congratulations to those of you who have served as House Captains and Deputy House Captains and have encouraged your members to earn house points for polite manners, kind acts, helpfulness and great work which lead to the award of the trophy to the House with the best overall results which I know brings great pride. Congratulations also to those of you who have served on the School Council and Eco Council and share a responsibility for protecting our environment.

Now we are coming to the end of a very busy year. You and all you teachers have deserved a well-earned rest! Enjoy your summer holidays and keep yourselves and others safe. Those of you who are coming back in September will find a number of changes. You will have newly painted classrooms and Reception and Nursery will move back into Early Years where a great deal of repair work has been done to the flooring and toilets. You have a new and exciting curriculum to look forward to which the staff have been working hard on.

Year 6 pupils will be moving on to secondary school in September and we wish them all the very best and hope they will settle in quickly, make lots of new friends as well as keeping up with their friends from Lemington Riverside.
