We will also be saying goodbye to a small number of children from other year groups on the final day of term, again, we wish them the very best in their new schools.

Kim Cole will be our new Attendance and Welfare Officer from September. Kim will be working in school every morning.

We will also be welcoming **Mr. Dan Jordan**, who will be joining us as a teacher. Mr. Jordan will be teaching in Years 1, 2 and 3 alongside Ms Turner, Miss Brush and Mr. Carter from September where we will split children into four smaller teaching groups for English and Maths. From our assessment data, we can see that these year groups have been hit the hardest by the pandemic and this is why we are reducing class numbers even more in these year groups from September. In the afternoons, Mr. Jordan will cover class teacher planning time in various classes.

Uniform bundles, uniform exchange and uniform expectations from September:

Mrs. Bainbridge and Mrs. Harris in the office are busy sorting all of the children's free uniform bundles and they will be sent home with the children before the end of next week. We hope that the free bundles are beneficial and ease at least one financial pressure this summer.

From September, we will expect all children to be in full uniform every day (unless there are agreed special circumstances agreed with the headteacher where this is not possible).

Don't forget, we also have our 'uniform exchange service' running from the school office now too – if you need any spare uniform, just drop us an email or call using the details above and if it's in stock we will arrange for you to be able to collect it. Thank you to everybody **Please note, we have relaxed our uniform policy until the end of this term due to the warmer weather.** Our full uniform expectations will resume in September.

Summer activities in Lemington:

There are a number of free summer activities for children aged 5-11 in Lemington this summer both at the Lemington Centre and at Sugley Church. Sunny weather & drinks

We continue to enjoy the sunshine this summer in Lemington! We do ask that you ensure your child comes to school with a bottle of water/squash, wear a sun hat/cap and apply sun cream before the start of the school day on sunny summer days.

Please note, from September children will only be allowed to bring bottles of water or still flavoured water into school as we move towards 'Healthy School' status. Fizzy, isotonic (including Oasis and Fruit Shoots) and energy drinks will not be allowed in school and if children do bring them in will be confiscated by staff and handed to parents/carers at the end of the day. Thank you for your support with this.

Free school meal supermarket vouchers

Newcastle City Council have notified us that we will be funded to provide free school meal vouchers for the summer holidays to those families entitled to free school meals. They will be sent out via the usual channels on Wednesday 20th July. Please note, if your circumstances have changed recently, your child may be entitled to free school meals. To apply for free school meals, Google 'Newcastle Free School Meals' and complete the online form. Alternatively, we can give you a paper copy of the application form if you visit the school office. If you ever find that you are struggling financially, please do come and have a confidential chat with us as there are a number of ways we might be able to support.

Parents evening and end of year reports

It was great to see so many parents and carers in school for our end of year parent's evenings this week. It has been a pleasure to read each of the children's end of year reports and write on my comment.
