Covid-19 updates

We continue to operate well as a school and have still had no cases of Covid-19 in the school. We are not being complacent, and stringent measures remain in place to keep our school Covid-19 secure. We thank parents/carers for supporting us with the measures, including wearing face coverings when entering the school site (unless medically exempt). Can we remind you all to keep at least 2 metres apart from other families.

Throughout the term a number of families and children have been advised to self-isolate at different points. A reminder that is anybody in your household develops Covid-19 symptoms (A high temperature, a continuous cough, a loss/change in taste or smell) your whole household should self-isolate immediately. The person with symptoms should seek a test by dialling 119. Your children can return to school once you have received confirmation of the negative test.

If a family, a class of children, or the whole-school were forced to self-isolate, daily online learning tasks will be provided through the SeeSaw app

(you can also log-in online through any laptop, PC or tablet). All children should now have had a letter with how to log-in to their SeeSaw account and they are all becoming experts in using the app at school. If you haven't got your log-in details or need some technical assistance, please speak to your child's class teacher at 8:40am or at the end of the day.

If your child is self-isolating and is entitled to benefit-related free school meals we can arrange free packed lunches. Please contact the school office on 0191 267 4315 or email admin@lemingtonriverside.newcastle.sch.uk on the first day of self-isolation to order packed lunches.
