# FREE SCHOOL MEALS:

We have been delivering free school meal packed lunches for the past two weeks to those children who are entitled and requested a delivery (Thank you to Mrs. Carver and all of her kitchen team for their hard work). The final day of deliveries will be Friday 3<sup>rd</sup> April 2020. The Government now have a supermarket voucher system in place from after the Easter Holidays. If your child is entitled to <u>benefit-related</u> Free School Meals, they will receive their voucher on MONDAY 20<sup>th</sup> APRIL along with a letter which will explain how further weekly vouchers can be obtained.

Please note that the supermarket voucher offer is only available for children on **<u>benefit-</u>** <u>related free school meals.</u>

## **GUIDANCE FOR WORKING AT HOME WITH YOUR CHILD:**

You must call school in advance to book your children on to this provision and speak directly to Mr. Heeley (Head Teacher) to confirm your place, as we are understandably running the school on a much reduced staff to keep as many people at home as possible. You will be asked to provide proof that you are a key worker by means of a letter from your employer.


## AND FINALLY...
