Who am I and how long have I been on the Governing Body?

My name is Liz Langfield and I am a member of the Governing Body at Lemington Riverside Primary School. I've been on the Governing Body since 2009.

Why did I decide to join the Governing Body?

I was thrilled to be asked if I would become a school governor in Lemington. I was at that time a local Councillor in Lemington and was very involved with many aspects of the local community.
