
Dear Parents, Carers and the Community of Lemington,

Welcome back to school following the half-term break. We have a number of important pieces of news to update you with as we enter March.

WORLD BOOK DAY 2020:

On **Thursday 5th March 2020**, we celebrate World Book Day alongside schools across the planet.

Our theme at LRPS this year is #WeLoveReading - on Thursday 5th we invite children to:

- ✓ Our teachers and teaching assistants will also be sharing their own favourite stories with the children throughout the day.



I would place on record our **huge thanks** to the team of 16-25 year old volunteers from the Newcastle United Foundation and Princes Trust who have spent the past two weeks transforming our Early Years outdoor space.

The youngsters were passionate about developing our space after visiting a number of potential project sites and successfully won a 'Dragons Den'-style competition to successfully secure funding to develop the space. The team have worked tirelessly through some pretty awful weather conditions to really put some love back into our only big green space in school and we (and more importantly our children) are so grateful!









FURTHER IMPROVED SECURITY:

We have had a brand new 'touch screen' sign-in system installed at our main reception. All visitors to the school must sign in on this screen which then takes a photo and prints a visitor sticker to be worn. If children arrive to school later than 9am they must be signed in by an adult on the screen – this will also record how many minutes late they are and the reason that they are late. Likewise, if you are collecting your child early for any reason, they must be signed out from school on the screen.



We have also had a brand new HD security camera installed on our main entrance so that entrance to the school is safer than ever. The double doors next to the main office are now electronically locked, ensuring that the main reception area is safe & secure at all times.

SPECIAL EDUCATIONAL NEEDS & DISABILITIES COORDINATOR (SENDCo):
